

Tulsa Port of Catoos

an integral part of the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System, the port is a 2,500-acre shipping and industrial park complex that houses 70 businesses.



Roughly 90 percent of goods that come through the port are agricultural. Take a self-guided driving tour through the port and be sure to visit the Maritime Education Center, even step on retired Tug Boat Charlie.

Moore's Fish Farm, established in 1962 and family-operated in Inola, Moore's host a fish fry on the third Friday and Saturday of the month, year-round. You can also visit the stock ponds, take some home if you'd like to stock your own.





Explore the City of Catoosa, connecting tourism, history, and culture to business and industry.

Home to Route 66, the Hard Rock Hotel & Casino and the iconic Blue Whale, Catoosa is a popular destination for visitors traveling down the Mother Road. Catoosa's rich history known for both the nostalgic Route 66 and Native American culture, can be experienced through out the city.



Catoosa's must see and do:

The Blue Whale-one of the more unique and recognizable Route 66 attractions, the Blue Whale was created by Hugh Davis. Mr. Davis created the park as a special place where his grandchildren could play and swim. Today, swimming is not permitted but it is a popular destination and photo hotspot. Bring your favorite meal for a picnic and enjoy the giant whale. www.cityofcatoosa.org/facilities

D.W. Correll Museum-The museum offers something for everyone. Spanning two buildings guests can explore antique cars and other items of history. The second building houses an extensive collection of rocks, gems, minerals and seashells from around the world.

Catoosa's Historical Museum-Paying homage to the railroad's significant role in Catoosa's history, the museum is located in the old train depot. The many displays will transport visitors back to the community's early days.

The Tulsa Port of Catoosa-the furthest inland port in the United States lies on 2,500 acres and is an integral part of the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System. The Port is home to more than 70 businesses in which roughly 90 percent of goods that come through the Port are agricultural. Fertilizer, soybeans and wheat are among the most shipped products. Take a driving tour, routes provided, and then stop and visit the Maritime Education Center to learn about the Port's history and the economic impact on

Favorite Annual Events:

Catoosa's LibertyFest celebrates the Fourth of July, but in late June. Held at Rogers Point Park, LibertyFest is four days full of fun! Enjoy the carnival each evening, visit unique vendors and don't miss the Fireworks on the final night.

Lighting of the Blue Whale kicks off the holiday season in Catoosa. See the Route 66 icon decorated in festive Christmas lights starting the Sunday after Thanksgiving and through the end of the year.

Cherokee Art Market, October 12-13, 2024 is held annually at the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino. The market is a great opportunity to collect the newest works from elite Native artists. More than 150 nationally renowned artists, representing tribes from across the United States, gather to compete for prizes and offer their work for sale.







Explore Chelsea, home of Oklahoma's Singing Cowboy Gene Autry

Chelsea was founded in 1881 as an Atlantic and Pacific Railroad stop. The community was incorporated under the law of the Cherokee Nation and was the home of Admiral Jocko Clark, the highest-ranking naval officer of Native American descent. Also, home of another great Cherokee Citizen, Clem McSpadden. A former U.S. Representative of Oklahoma's 2nd Congressional District, and an American Rodeo Announcer and inductee to the Pro Rodeo Hall of Fame, his rodeo career lasted more than 50 years. Clem announced the National Finals Rodeo 27 times, and crossed into Canada to announce the Calgary Stampede and the Canadian Finals Rodeo, both of which he was the first American to announce the events.

You won't want to miss Chelsea's iconic Route 66 attractions, such as the Pryor Creek Bridge. Part of the original Route 66 alignment, this historic 123-foot bridge is the only unaltered bridge left in Oklahoma today. While it is no longer drivable, visitors can walk along this incredible piece of history.

A visit to Chelsea isn't complete without walking under Route 66! The Route 66 Pedestrian Underpass will take you across the highway without dodging traffic. But don't forget to take in the mural and sign your name as you walk across. While you're in town, be sure to drive by the Hogue House. Located on the National Register of Historic Places, the Hogue House was the first Sears & Roebuck home to be shipped west of the Mississippi, and was built in 1912.

Foyil

Foyil, home of the world's largest Totem Pole, a Route 66 icon.



If you are cruising Route 66 you have to stop in Foyil! First stop by *Andy Payne Park* on the original alignment, have a picnic and stretch your legs by visiting the *Route 66 Texaco Filing Station* on the same property. Then make your way east on highway 28-A to Totem Pole Park.

You literally can't miss it as you drive closer, it is 90 feet tall and made of red sandstone, steel, wood and concrete. Artist and Veteran, Ed Galloway spent his retirement building a unique park and in 1999, it was added to the National Register of Historic Places. Nearby is the "Fiddle House", located in the gift shop. The "Fiddle House" displays Galloway's hand-crafted fiddles and other inlaid wood artifacts. www.rchs1.org/totem-pole-park

Foyil's hometown hero, Andy Payne, was a Cherokee Citizen from Foyil won the Great Transcontinental Footrace, a 3,400-mile race from Los Angeles to New York City that followed much of the path of then-new Route 66. Upon returning to Oklahoma he paid off the family farm with his winnings and set off to clerk for the Oklahoma Supreme Court.

While in Foyil, stop at *Annie's Dine*r for a good old fashion cheeseburger and fries, or if you are out and about earlier, stop in for their famous omelets or biscuits and gravy...you can't go wrong!









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Inola

Inola, Where Two Tribal Nations Meet

Located at the southern point of Rogers County, Inola is enriched with Native American Culture from two tribes; the Creek Nation and the Cherokee Nation. A historic marker is placed where the territories for each lie. Boasting as the "Hay Capital of the World" where farmers and ranchers produce and harvest a large supply of high quality of Bluestem Prairie Hay.

This charming community is just twenty minutes from Claremore and is accessible to highways, interstates, railroads and the Verdigris waterway resulting in global manufacturers such as Sofidel Paper Mill, an Italian company; and Enel North America Solar Panel Manufacturing who announced their \$2 billion investment in the summer 2023.



Inola's must see and do

Moore's Fish Farm-need to stock your pond or just try the best catfish dinner around? Dinners are the third Friday and Saturday of the month, year-round. You won't be disappointed!

Fuller's Car Museum-Walk through time with this impressive collection of 19 well-preserved vehicles designed between 1917-1953.

McClellan-Kerr Navigation System and Robert F. Hunter Lock and Dam 18 USACE Visitor Center-featuring two stories of interactive displays, 360 experiences and interpretive panels, along with a free picnic area, visitors will be in awe of the history of the navigation system.







International Boundary Marker between the Cherokee and Creek Nationsplaced in the 1890's, the marker designates the boundary between the two tribes.

Historic Black Fox Nuclear Site-this historic site sits three miles from downtown Inola and was set to be the home of a \$3.4 billion nuclear power plant. But in 1982 the project was canceled after a partial plant meltdown in Pennsylvania.

Oologah

Oologah, the Birthplace of Will Rogers

Oologah means "Dark Cloud" in Cherokee, but there is only sunshine on the Birthplace Ranch. Experience a unique glimpse into the life of vaudeville performer, famous actor, Cherokee

Cowboy and American humorist Will Rogers (1879-1935) at the Will Rogers Birthplace Ranch, nicknamed "The White House on the Verdigris".

Known as the Cherokee Kid, Will Rogers' family was of strong Cherokee lineage. Rogers' mother and father were Cherokees, and all were proud of their heritage. Will never lived in Oklahoma, as the state was still Indian Territory until 1907.

Recently purchased by the Cherokee Nation, the Will Rogers Birthplace Ranch will undergo structural and integrity improvements, along with renovated amenities and plans of future growth. The ranch is currently closed for these projects until the end of 2024. But check back for updates at https://wisitcherokeenation.com

Love the great outdoors, then you will love Oologah. Home of *Oologah Lake* where fishing is abundant, boating, water skiing, kayaking, swimming, and camping are some of the most popular activities on this beautiful area. Talala, the Gateway to Will Rogers Country

Talala is a rural community rich in agriculture with small-town appeal. Visitors often find local farmers and ranchers gathered at the local grocery store or the large feed mill. Home to several noteworthy residents, Talala is home to Rogers County's first Medal of Honor recipient, Roy W. Harmon and the 2016 GEICO Bassmaster Classic Champion, Edwin Evers. The community got its start as a major railroad shipping hub for cattle. Located near Oologah Lake, Talala connects visitors with great fishing and boating as well as the birthplace of Will Rogers.

Home of the Winganon Space Capsule, which started as an accident, is now one of Oklahoma's most memorable and fun photo ops. In 1959, a cement mixer wrecked, leaving behind a heavy mixer. Over the years it has been painted many times, but in 2011 it was redesigned into a space capsule with the NASA logo, rocket thrusters and shiny aluminum paint.

Verdigris, the Mother Road Connection between Claremore and Catoosa

Verdigris was originally established as a trading colony in the 1700's with the Osage, Delaware and Cherokee Nations. French traders named the Verdigris River after the French word for the water's green hue. When the town was incorporated in 1980, it adopted the name of this vital waterway, which links to the Tulsa Port of Catoosa at the head of the McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System.

Today Verdigris is a vibrant small community focused on family activities, contemporary housing, a golf course, top-notch schools and businesses along Route 66.

A Route 66 road trip is not complete unless you have stopped at *The Nut*



House, located in the heart of Verdigris. The Nut-House is a full-service deli, with an extensive gift shop, fresh fudge and of course, nuts. It is a tourist's dream stop with plenty of fun souvenirs to take home. Inside, you will find Hot Mama's Deli where daily specials, including dessert, are always a local favorite. Plenty of seating and a great rest stop for any size family.

Stretch your legs at *Lone Pine Golf Course*, a 9-hole course primarily consisting of par-3 holes. The course offers a complete set of golf practice facilities including a driving range, along with a large putting/chipping green.

Visit Claremore, the county seat of Rogers County, located in the heart of northeast Oklahoma on Historic Route 66.



Claremore is the hometown of legendary Will Rogers. A cowboy, movie star, humorist, radio and news commentator and Vaudeville Performer. But there's more iconic Oklahomans we are known for. The Singing Rage Miss Patti Page; the original collector of the world's largest privately-owned gun collection at the J.M. Davis Arms & Historical Museum, Mr. J.M. Davis; Stuart Roosa, Command Module Pilot for the Apollo 14 Mission; and Lynn Riggs, a play write whose work, "Green Grows the Lilacs", became Rodgers and Hammerstein's Broadway, Big Screen and international sensation, "Oklahoma!".

Known as Museum City, Claremore is home to more museums per capita than anywhere in the United states. Home of the world class Will Rogers Memorial Museum, the J.M. Davis Arms & Historical Museum, the Oklahoma Military Academy Museum and the Claremore Museum of History, we are a history and museum lovers dream!

Located on Historic Route 66, just miles from Tulsa, Claremore's Lilac District in historic downtown is shopping heaven.
